

## Some information about Child Car Seat Safety

When using a seatbelt on a child:

1. The safest place for a child under the age of 13 is the back seat.

2. Make sure the shoulder strap lies centred across your child's shoulder and the middle of the chest (not the neck or face) and the lap belt crosses over the hips (not the stomach)

3. Check that the shoulder strap is not under your child's arm or behind their back

Do not place a child in a seating position in front of an air bag that is not turned off.
